

## District Report Cards

The Ohio Department of Education released school report cards at the end of February. Versailles Schools did well overall. Below is an overview.

In Achievement, our Performance Index grade is a B. Our Performance Index score is 98.8. This ranks the district tied for 94th out of 609 public school districts in the state. Our modified Performance Index score from the state is 103.2, which ranks us 41st in the state. Modified scores only count students who took the test. Indicators Met grade is an A. The A is reflective of having all grade levels meet the passing proficiency rate for each test. Our Performance Index score is lower than previous years. Here are a couple of pieces of information that went into this:

- Last year was the first time students took state testing on the computer, the test was more difficult (as expected).
- The state legislature has since changed the testing designer and removed itself from the multi state collaborative that developed the tests.
- Gap Closing measures how well each student is succeeding regardless of income, race, ethnicity, or disability. We received a C grade. This grade was

lowered from a B because our subgroup of students with disabilities did not meet required passing rates in math and reading.

- Progress Grades are based on 4th-8th grade students in reading and math. These grades are called Value Added. C grades mean students are averaging a year's worth of growth for the year. A is greater than a year's growth and F is less than a year's growth. The district overall received an A grade for this. There are some areas that were less than a year's growth within results that will be investigated.

Finance information is also included on the report card. The 2014-2015 state average on spending per pupil is \$9,228, Versailles EVSD is at \$8,053. While the district has invested additional dollars in recent years for All-Day/Every Day Kindergarten and class size reduction among others, spending is still well below average. The district is committed to financially maintaining an effective and efficient educational organization.
